Typical Case Battle Game Modes

To keep the format interesting, platforms have introduced a number of variations to the basic ruleset.



Game Mode Description Best For **Standard (Classic)** 2 to 4 gamers open the very same cases. The player with the highest total product value wins everything. Traditionalists searching for straightforward gameplay. **Team Battle (2v2/ 3v3)** Players split into teams. The combined product worth of the winning team determines who takes the pot. Necessary Safety Checklist

- **Enable Steam Guard:** Ensure your mobile authenticator is active to protect your account from unapproved trade offers.
