Fixing a Sagging Door

1. Open the door and find the top hinge.

3. Remove the middle screw on the jamb side of the leading hinge.
4. Change the short screw with a 3-inch wood screw. As you drive it in, it will anchor into the strong wall stud behind the door frame, pulling the top of the door back into positioning.

Getting rid of Drafts

Drafty doors waste energy and allow bugs.

1. Examine the door boundary while closed on a warm day to see where light shines through.
2. Eliminate old, fragile weatherstripping from the door jamb.
3. Tidy the surface area completely.
4. Measure and cut brand-new V-strip, foam tape, or rubber gasket weatherstripping to fit the leading and sides of the frame.
5. Press or nail the new material strongly into place.
