Uncommon Drop Pool	Discontinued cases that no longer drop regularly as end-of-match rewards.	Very Rare (approx. <<1%chance)	CS: GO Weapon Case, Chroma Case, Gamma Case

2. Anatomy of a Case Opening: What are the Odds?

Opening **Additional resources** a CS2 case requires two things: the case itself and a matching **Key** (acquired in-game for £ 2.50 GBP). When combined, the case spins through a randomized sequence before landing on a weapon surface.

- **Special Item/ Rare (Gold/ Knives & & Gloves):** ~ 0.26%
