What is Crazy Time?

At its core, Crazy Time is a live dealer video game reveal developed around a massive, vertically installed 52-segment wheel. Hosted by charming presenters in a vibrant, carnival-themed studio, the video game is relayed in high-definition with increased reality elements seamlessly woven into the gameplay.

The primary objective is basic: gamers put bets <https://bitz.io/games/crazy-time> on which segment the wheel will stop on. However, the addition of a Top Slot multiplier in every round-- together with 4 wildly different reward games-- elevates it far beyond a standard wheel-of-fortune video game.

Understanding the Wheel Segments

The 52-segment wheel is divided into numbers and reward video games. The numbers pay out even money or better, while the benefit signs give players entry into the game's headline acts.

Here is how the wheel is distributed:

- **Number 1:** 21 sections (Pays 1:1)
- **Number 2:** 13 segments (Pays 2:1)
- **Number 5:** 7 sectors (Pays 5:1)
- **Number 10:** 4 segments (Pays 10:1)
- **Coin Flip:** 4 sections
- **Pachinko:** 2 sectors
- **Cash Hunt:** 2 sectors
- **Crazy Time:** 1 sector

The Top Slot Feature

Before every spin of the main wheel, a two-reel mini fruit machine situated directly above the wheel spins all at once.

- **Reel 1** screens a bet area (either a number or a benefit video game).
- **Reel 2** display screens a multiplier (ranging from 2x approximately 50x).

If the bet spot and the multiplier align horizontally, that multiplier is applied to the matching segment on the primary wheel for that round. If the wheel lands on that section, all wins for that bet are multiplied accordingly, setting the phase for massive payouts.

Dive Into the Four Bonus Rounds

The true magic-- and volatility-- of Crazy Time lies in its 4 interactive benefit rounds. These video games transport gamers out of the studio through CGI and offer the video game's greatest win potential.

1. Coin Flip

The easiest of the bonus rounds, Coin Flip includes a red-and-blue token turned by a maker.

- **How it works:** Before the flip, both sides of the coin are appointed random multipliers.
- **The Outcome:** Whichever color lands face up awards the gamer the multiplier attached to that side.

2. Pachinko

Motivated by the conventional Japanese arcade game, Pachinko features a big physical wall filled with pegs.

- **How it works:** The host drops a puck from the top of the board. It bounces randomly down through the pegs until it lands in among several multiplier slots at the bottom.
- **The "Double" Feature:** If the puck lands in a "DOUBLE" slot, all multipliers at the bottom of the board double, and the puck is dropped once again for a chance at even larger rewards.

3. Money Hunt

Cash Hunt is an interactive shooting gallery video game presented on a massive screen with 108 random multipliers concealed behind different signs (like a cactus, a target, or a chef's hat).

- **How it works:** Players utilize an on-screen cannon to intend and contend a symbol of their choice before the countdown timer expires. As soon as the timer ends, all players expose the multiplier concealed behind their picked target. (Note: In automated play, the video game selects a target for the player).

4. Crazy Time

The supreme reward round and the hardest to trigger. The host opens a red door, leading gamers into a surreal, vibrantly colored virtual world featuring an enormous, 64-segment wheel.

- **How it works:** Players should select one of 3 flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The host spins the wheel, and whichever multiplier the selected flapper points to when the wheel stops is awarded to the player.
- **The "Double" and "Triple" sections:** Just like Pachinko, if the wheel stops on a "DOUBLE" or "TRIPLE" segment, all multipliers on the wheel increase appropriately, and the wheel is spun once again. This is where the optimum 20,000 x multiplier can be attained.

Pros and Cons of Playing Crazy Time

Like all gambling establishment games, Crazy Time features its own unique set of benefits and prospective drawbacks.



Pros:

- **Unmatched Entertainment Value:** High-energy hosts, bright visuals, and game-show styling make it incredibly fun to enjoy and play.
- **Huge Win Potential:** With the aid of the Top Slot and benefit round multipliers, wins can rise to 20,000 x the stake.
- **Interactive Elements:** Games like Cash Hunt and Crazy Time need (or simulate) player participation, adding a layer of engagement not found in traditional slots.
- **Social Atmosphere:** The incorporated live chat enables gamers from worldwide to celebrate wins together.

Cons:

- **High Volatility:** Because a big part of the wheel's payout capacity is connected to perk rounds, droughts can quickly drain a bankroll.
- **Lower RTP on Bonuses:** While standard number bets have a reasonably decent Return to Player, betting solely on perk rounds typically brings a lower theoretical RTP.
- **Hectic:** Rounds occur quickly, which can result in spending too much if players do not handle their bankrolls thoroughly.

Fundamental Strategies for Crazy Time

While Crazy Time is a game of pure possibility dictated by a random number generator (RNG) and physical wheel physics, players typically use wagering techniques to handle danger and extend their playtime.

- **The Cover-All Strategy:** Betting on all or many of the sections (numbers and bonus offer games) guarantees you seldom miss out on a spin, though the cost of covering the board can exceed the smaller sized payments.
- **Bonus offer Chasing:** Focusing specifically on the perk rounds (Coin Flip, Pachinko, Cash Hunt, and Crazy Time). This is a high-risk, high-reward strategy since bonus rounds take place on just 9 of the 52 sections.
- **Statistical Betting:** Relying on the game's history tracker. Some players like to bank on segments that haven't hit in a long period of time (the "hot/cold" fallacy), though previous spins statistically have no bearing on future results.

Crazy Time has actually rightfully earned its credibility as a leader in live dealer entertainment. By combining the classic appeal of a television video game reveal with modern-day digital graphics and enormous payment capacity, Evolution Gaming has produced an experience that attract both casual gamers and high-stakes gamblers alike.
