Your triage procedure begins the moment you discover the leak: walk to that valve. If you cannot locate it before an emergency happens, you've already failed the first checkpoint. This secondary shutoff sequence lets you restore water to the rest of your home while keeping that problem fixture offline. This checkpoint matters because homeowners often panic and leave the main valve closed for hours, freezing out drinking water, showers, and toilets across the entire house. The shutoff sequence is staged for a reason: isolate the problem zone first, then evaluate whether you need full system shutdown or just fixture isolation.
