Comprehending Wear Conditions and Float Values

When gamers get a skin, its condition is designated among five official wear tiers. The physical look modifications substantially across these categories, frequently exposing scratches, fading colors, or tainted metal.

Wear Tier	Float Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Pristine condition with minimal to no visible wear. Typically the most pricey version of a skin.
Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Minor imperfections or small scratches, usually only visible upon close assessment.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Moderate wear. Scratches and paint breaking become clearly noticeable on the body and barrel.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Significant wear. Significant portions of the paint are faded, and heavy scratches are prominent.

Battle-Scarred (BS) 0.45-- 1.00 Incredibly worn. The weapon often looks heavily rusted, filthy, or nearly totally stripped of paint. *(Note: Some skins look distinctively cool in this condition, earning the label "Blackimov").*

The CS2 Economy: Cases, Keys, and the Marketplace
