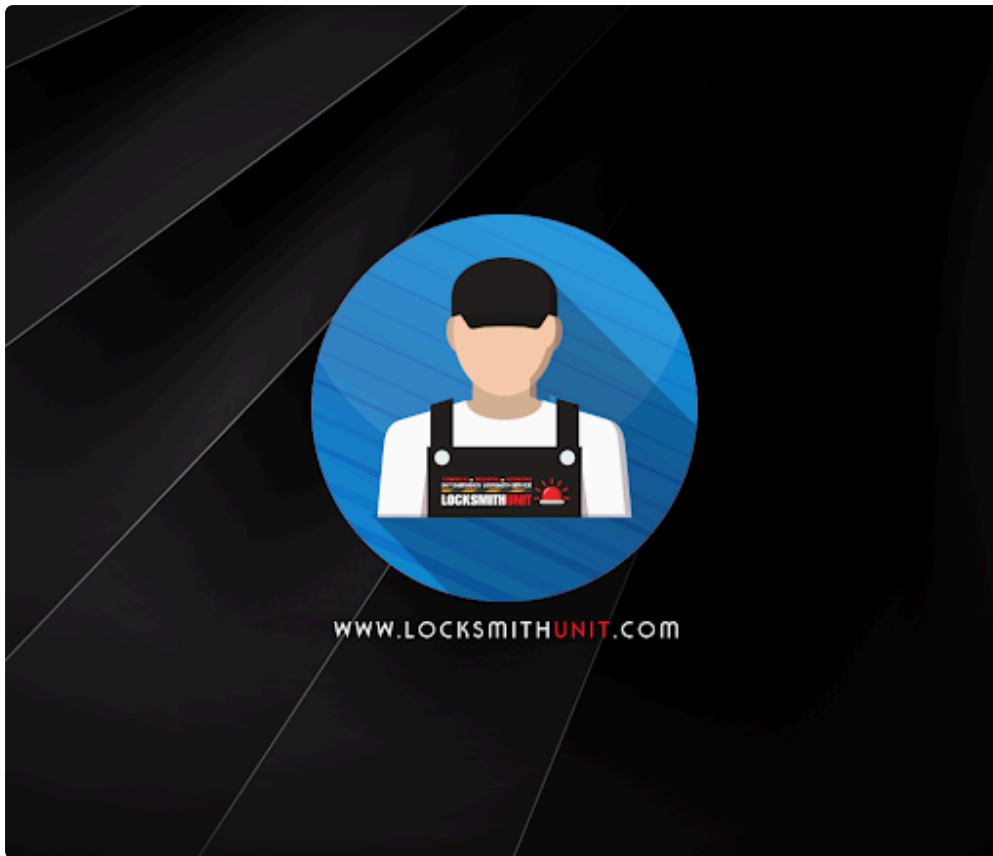

What mobile service changes

A careful locksmith reads those clues before reaching for new hardware, because a good fix should address the real cause, not just the symptom. Rekeying, repair, or replacement

If a homeowner has moved into a new place, lost a key, or wants to limit access after a roommate change, rekey locks can restore confidence without replacing every visible part of the lock. A good [rekey locks](#) depends on the condition of the cylinders, the keyway, and the surrounding door hardware. If the door is already misaligned, rekeying alone will not cure a latch that sticks.

Repair sits in the middle of the spectrum and is often overlooked because people jump too quickly to replacement. It is also where a [door lock repair](#) call can save real money if the technician knows when to rebuild and when to stop. A careful technician will usually explain that trade-off instead of pushing one answer for every home.

That can happen after break-in damage, after years of wear, or after repeated problems that keep returning even after service visits. In those moments, a [lock installation](#) is less about upselling and more about resetting the door to a reliable baseline. A replacement should be chosen for the door in front of you, not for a generic idea of what every house ought to have.

What changes when keys are no longer the whole story
