However, once saturation extends beyond two days, materials begin breaking down at a cellular level—fibers separate, adhesives fail, and microbial growth becomes irreversible.

How Saturation Time Affects Whether Your Possessions Can Be Recovered

The moment water enters your home, a countdown begins. Within the first 6 to 12 hours, most hard materials and sealed surfaces remain salvageable. By 24 hours, porous materials like fabric, paper, and foam begin experiencing permanent structural damage. After 48 hours, microbial colonization accelerates, and restoration becomes a health hazard rather than a recovery operation. This timeline is not theoretical—it is the difference between saving a box of photographs or losing them forever.

Identifying Salvageable Items Based on Material Composition and Water Category

Water damage falls into three categories, and each affects what you can expect to save. Category 1 water—clean water from a burst supply line—poses minimal contamination risk and allows us to save nearly all hard materials and many soft goods. Category 2 water, which contains some contaminants, reduces salvageability of absorbent items but still allows recovery of sealed wood, metal, and ceramic pieces. Category 3 water—from sewage or

severe flooding—requires us to discard nearly all porous materials and focus only on items that can be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.

Understanding your water source determines what guidance we give you about what stays and what goes. If your basement flooded due to heavy runoff near Colorado Springs Fire Station 16 on Farthing Dr or similar low-lying areas, we classify that as category 2 or 3 contamination, which narrows your salvage list significantly. Hard plastic storage bins, sealed metal tools, and ceramic collectibles survive. Cardboard boxes, fabric, and books do not.
