- A minor mound or superficial dip in the lawn
- Grass that grows in different ways over one rectangle-shaped area
- A patch with much less snow cover in winter season or faster springtime thaw

- Old cleanout pipelines, assessment ports, or a faint line from house to yard
- A worn path where the container has actually been pumped before

Know what type of storage tank you may be dealing with

The feeling of the probe changes with the tank product. Concrete provides a firm, apparent stop. Fiberglass and plastic containers can feel slightly much less sharp, particularly if there is compressed fill over them. Older steel tanks, if one is still in service, may give blended comments because deterioration and partial collapse can alter the surface.

Use your hands and body weight, not hostile force. Press right down in measured steps. Draw it back out, move a foot or two, and repeat. 2. Probe in a straight line away from the house, using light stress every 12 to 24 inches.
3. When you obtain a solid quit at a repeatable depth, probe around that location to define the rectangle-shaped footprint.
4. Once the rundown is clear, determine most likely lid places near the inlet or center, relying on storage tank style.
5. Hand dig thoroughly to reveal the cover or accessibility riser.

A probe check made the mistake evident. The tough stop appeared at one area only. 2 feet away, the pole moved down much deeper. The actual container was further downslope, exactly where your home drain line pointed.

How much from your home ought to you expect the tank?

There is no solitary magic number, yet some ranges prevail sufficient to be valuable. Several domestic septic tanks are mounted about 10 to 20 feet from the house. Twenty-five feet is still normal. Beyond that, the probabilities depend on site constraints, incline, regional codes, and when the system was installed.

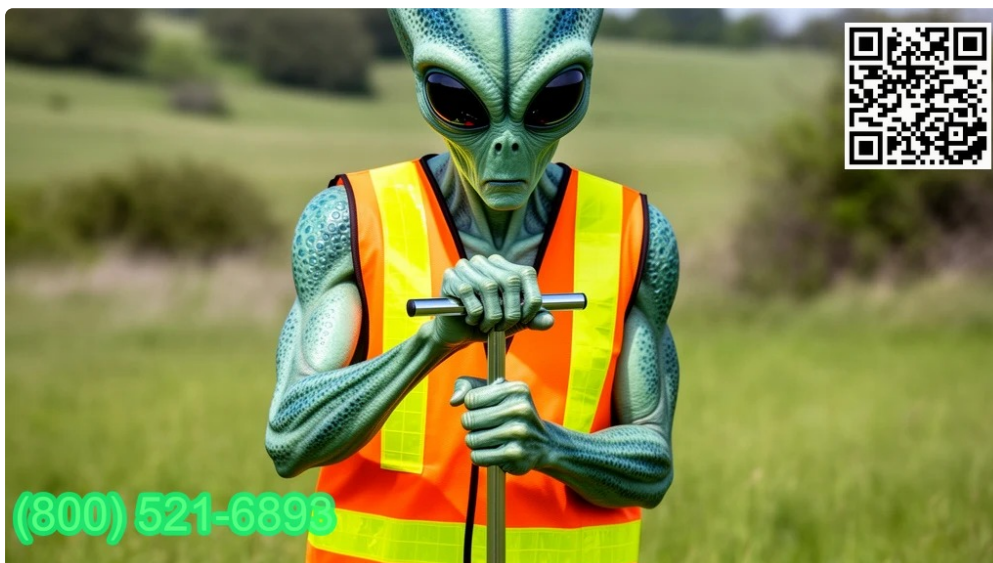

Situations where a probe may not be enough

So can ground filled with origins. If the tank is deeper than anticipated, under hardscape, or concealed by major regrading, you may require added methods.
