A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 chances, minus a little platform commission (rake). **Jackpot** Numerous gamers contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's value figures out the player's "ticket" share. A spinner selects one winner who takes everything. Based upon the overall worth contributed; platform takes a percentage charge.
