### Vulnerability of Minors

In spite of age restrictions (usually 18+), many platforms have historically done not have robust identity confirmation (KYC) procedures. This has led to prevalent criticism relating to the direct exposure of minors to gambling mechanics.

## Best Practices for Digital Safety
