- **Foggy Double-Paned Glass:** Indicates that the seal between the 2 panes has actually failed, permitting moisture and condensation to get caught within.

remain constant. 1. Safety First Broken glass is inherently unsafe. Anybody managing the repair must wear durable work gloves, protective eyeglasses, and closed-toe shoes. If the glass is completely shattered, laying down a tarpaulin or heavy plastic sheeting around the work

area captures falling fragments. 2. Removing the Door Panel(If Applicable)For most moving patio doors or inset door panels, it is much easier to work on the glass if the door is gotten rid of from its frame and laid flat on a workbench or saw-horses. Unlatch and raise sliding doors out of their tracks.

- from the frame. Clearing Residue: Scrape away old silicone, putty,

or double-sided glazing tape. Wipe the rabbet(the recess where the glass sits) tidy so the new glass will sit flush. 4. Measuring and Installing the Replacement Glass Accurate measurements are crucial.

- **Procedure the height, width, and density of the glass opening. Use a fresh bead of silicone sealant or new**
- **glazing tape to the frame. Carefully set the new piece of glass into the opening, pushing gently to produce a tight seal. Re-install the stops, beads, or cut to protect the glass in location.**
