Understanding how Garage Door Springs Work—and Why They Fail

A **torsion spring** is positioned on a shaft above the door opening. It stores energy as the spring is wound and releases that energy through drums and lift cables as the door operates. Torsion systems are widely used on modern sectional doors because they provide controlled movement and can offer reliable balance when correctly sized and adjusted.

An **extension spring** is positioned along the horizontal tracks, usually on either side of the door. It stretches and contracts as the door operates. These systems typically require safety cables to help contain a spring if it breaks. Both torsion and extension springs are under significant tension and should be handled by a qualified technician using the proper tools.

Springs eventually wear out from repeated cycles. Rust, incorrect sizing, excessive door weight, worn rollers, damaged cables, and poor balance can hasten failure. In Los Angeles, coastal corrosion can affect metal components in communities such as Santa Monica, Venice, Long Beach, and Redondo Beach. Salt air may lead to deterioration of springs, cables, rollers, and other hardware.

Never attempt to sever, unwind, stretch, or remove a spring without the proper training. Stored spring energy can cause severe injury. If the door is stuck over a vehicle, leaves an access point unsecured, or creates an urgent hazard, request emergency Garage door repair and follow the technician's instructions.

The garage door opener is then restored to operation and tested. The technician should inspect the opener's travel limits, force response, mounting, and operation. **Photo-eye sensors** should be aligned and tested so the door reverses when the sensor beam is interrupted. The **manual release** should also be demonstrated so you know how to operate the door during a power outage or opener failure.

Final garage door testing should include opening and closing cycles, reversing features, cable movement, rollers, hinges, and visible fasteners. A safety inspection helps verify that the repaired door operates as a coordinated system rather than simply confirming that the spring turns.
