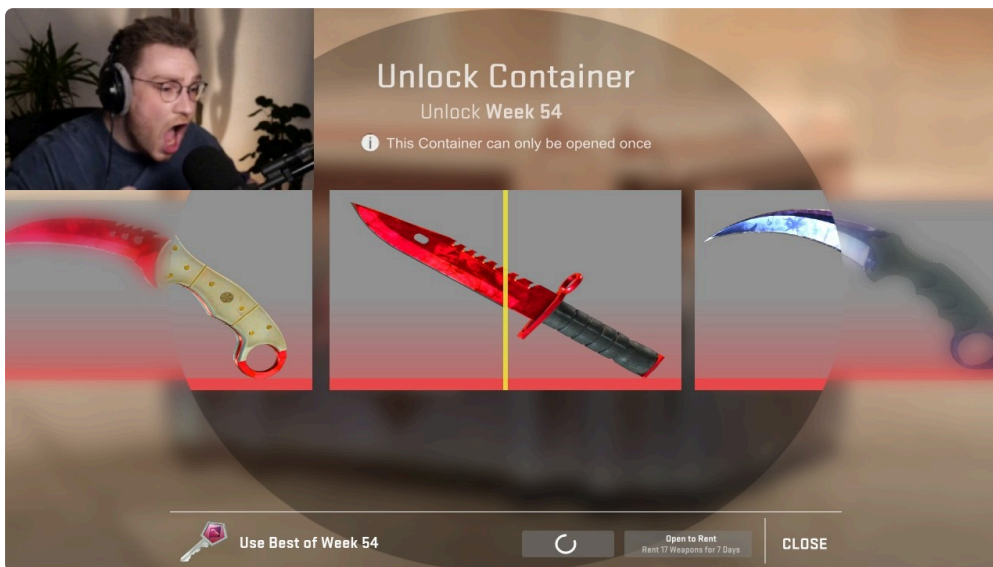

Smart Strategies and Responsible Practices
