*Keep in mind: There is a different, independent 10% chance that any opened product will be in **StatTrak** condition, which tracks the variety of eliminates made with that weapon.*

Kinds Of CS2 Cases

The CS2 case ecosystem is broadly divided into two primary categories:

1. Active Drop Pool Cases

These are cases presently dropping to players actively using Valve official matchmaking servers. Since of the high supply, their market value are usually low (typically under £ 1.00 GBP).

- *Examples:* Kilowatt Case, Gallery Case, Recoil Case.

2. Uncommon (Discontinued) Drop Pool Cases

When Valve introduces a new case, older cases are normally pushed into the "uncommon drop pool." They hardly ever drop after matches, implying their supply is strictly finite. As players open them, fewer exist, increasing the cost.

- *Examples:* Huntsman Weapon Case, CS: GO Weapon Case 3, Operation Breakout Weapon Case.
