

In Los Angeles, a garage door repair usually costs between **\$150 and \$700**, depending on the failed component, door size, accessibility, and whether service is needed during normal business hours. Minor adjustments may cost less, while a broken spring, damaged panel, opener replacement, or emergency repair can raise the total.
