Factors That Influence Rarity

1. **Drop Rate**-- The possibility of a case looking like a random drop is exceptionally low for some older cases. For example, the Operation Bravo Case drops are roughly 0.15% compared to 1-- 2% for modern-day cases.
2. **Event Duration**-- Cases connected to limited-time operations (e.g., Bravo, Shattered Web) cease to be awarded as soon as the operation ends. This produces a difficult supply ceiling.
3. **Promo Type**-- Some cases were just dispersed through purchase of particular "Starter Packs" or as benefits for participation in tournaments. These promotion-only cases can be more evasive than standard drop-only boxes.
4. **Skin Popularity**-- The existence of highly preferable "Covert" or "Classified" skins inflates demand. The AK-47 Fire Serpent, for example, makes the Operation Bravo Case particularly important.
5. **Age and Nostalgia**-- Early CS: GO cases carry historic significance, appealing to veterans and collectors who missed the original release windows.

How Collectors Acquire Rare Cases

- **Steam Marketplace:** The main venue for buying cases outright. Prices are set by sellers; market charges apply.
- **Third-Party Trading Sites:** Platforms such as CSGOSkins.gg, Skinbay, or Buff.163 typically list cases at slightly lower commissions, but confirm seller track record.
- **Community Giveaways & Events:** Occasionally, Valve or community influencers host free gifts where older cases are awarded. Taking part in main CS: GO competitions can likewise yield legacy case drops.
- **Bundle Purchase:** Some collectors buy "secret boxes" that may contain older cases; nevertheless, this method is dangerous and typically not cost-effective.

Tips for New Collectors

- **Research Before Buying:** Verify the case's credibility (some fake listings exist). Utilize the Steam Community Market's "listings history" to evaluate cost trends.
