- By enjoying the tournament live by means of the Steam television or in-game customer, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge using a Viewer Pass, gamers can make Souvenir Cases specific to that tournament.
- These cases do not require an essential to open, making them 100% complimentary worth once got.
