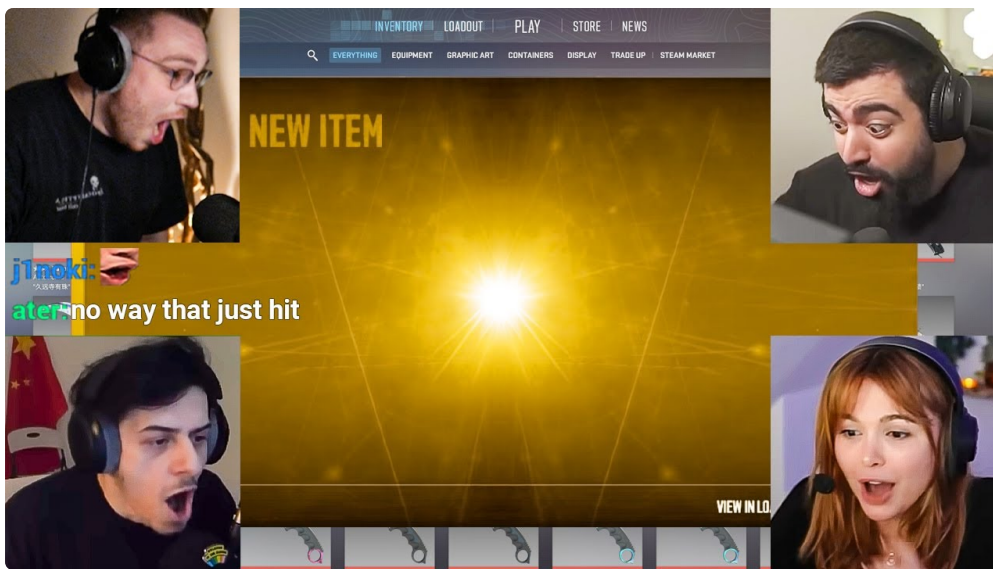

- **Make Use Of 1v1 Duels First:** If you wish to manage your chances mathematically, 1v1 battles offer a 50% opportunity of winning (excluding website house edges), making them much easier to manage than 4-player free-for-alls.
