Note: Total segments equal 52. The perk rounds collectively occupy 9 segments, meaning a player will see a perk feature roughly every 5.7 spins on average.

Checking Out the Four Bonus Rounds in Demo Mode

The main appeal of Crazy Time is its quartet of extremely imaginative reward minigames. Using a demo or viewer mode enables users to witness these functions without financial stress.

- **1. Coin Flip:** A simple red-vs-blue digital coin toss. Before the flip, multipliers are assigned to each side. Whichever side lands face up awards the corresponding multiplier to the gamer's stake.
- **2. Cash Hunt:** A huge screen including 108 random multipliers hidden behind shooting gallery symbols. Players (or the video game AI in demo/auto-play) goal a cannon at a target, revealing the multiplier underneath.
