(Note: These percentages apply to the base product tier. If an item drops, there is an additional 10% possibility that it will feature StatTrak technology, which lowers the base odds <https://cs2skin.com/cases> of getting a particular product variation even further.)

To put these numbers into perspective, the chance of unpacking an unusual, high-tier Knife or set of Gloves is approximately **1 in 385**.

Understanding Float Values and Conditions

Even if a player beats the chances and lands a high-tier product, the fight is just half won. Every weapon dropped from a case is assigned a **Float Value**-- a number in between 0.00 and 1.00 that figures out the wear condition of the skin.

The wear conditions are categorized as follows:

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.37
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.37-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Various skins have different wear limits. Some skins can not be acquired in Factory New condition, indicating the top-tier float values are remarkably rare and command enormous costs on the Steam Community Market.

Why Do Players Keep Opening Cases?

With such overwhelming odds, why is the case-opening economy worth billions of dollars? The psychology behind CS: GO case odds relies greatly on cognitive predispositions.

- **The Near-Miss Effect:** Watching the cursor slowly tick past a Gold product and arrive at a cheap Blue item sets off the exact same mental action in the brain as a win, motivating another effort.
- **Variable Reward Schedules:** Much like a slots, the unpredictability of the reward keeps gamers engaged. You never ever understand *when* the payout will occur, only that it *could* take place on the next try.
- **The Investment Illusion:** Some players see case opening as an investment, wishing to pull a rare product that will value in worth over time.
