Prevent discarding your whole spending plan into a single high-tier case like *Operation Bravo* or *Recoil*. Instead, mix low-tier, stable-return cases with **Article source** a few high-variance cases to balance the risk.

4. Use "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

Crazy Mode (where the most affordable total worth wins) turns standard reasoning on its head. While it can be enjoyable, it relies completely on striking inexpensive, low-tier drops. Do not approach this mode with standard case-opening reasoning.
