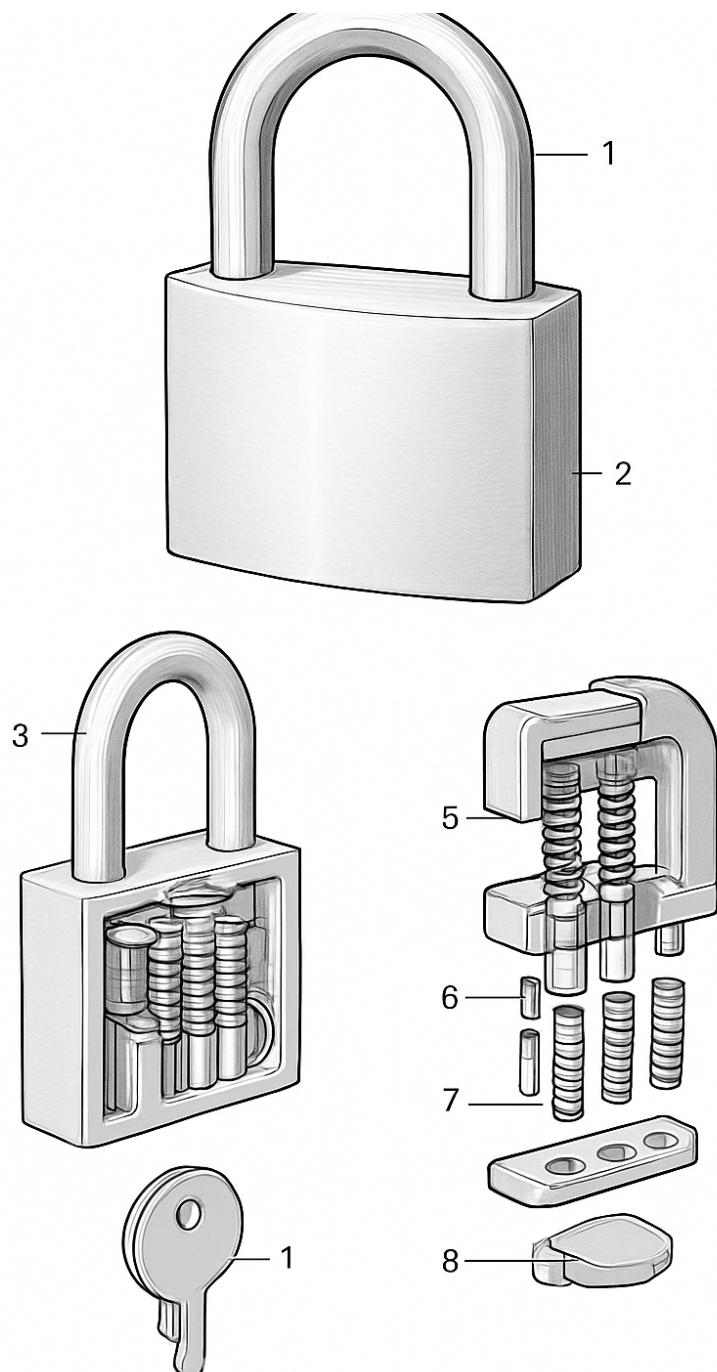
How Orlando drivers think through car key issues
