The weapon looks greatly rusted, beaten, or nearly removed of paint.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," meaning they can not drop in Factory New condition, while others in fact look better with greater wear (referred to as "Blackimovs" on specific AWP models).

2. Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are color-coded based upon their rarity. This rarity dictates how tough the item is to acquire through random drops or by opening weapon cases with secrets.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, basic drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly much better than Consumer Grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** Standard quality for a lot of collection drops and low-tier case products.
- **Limited (Purple):** Uncommon; typically utilized as trade-up fodder.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Rare, highly desired weapon surfaces.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest basic rarity discovered in cases, including renowned designs like the AWP|Asiimov or M4A4|Wail.
- **Extremely Rare (★ Gold):** Special items, including Knives and Gloves.

Approximate Case Odds

Opening cases is a type of gambling, and the chances heavily prefer the house. According to neighborhood research and Valve's official disclosures in particular areas, the rough possibilities of unboxing products are:



- **Mil-Spec (Blue):** ~ 79.92%
- **Restricted (Purple):** ~ 15.98%
- **Classified (Pink):** ~ 3.20%
- **Covert (Red):** ~ 0.64%
- **Special Item (★ Gold/Knife/Gloves):** ~ 0.26%

3. The Anatomy of Skin Value

1. **Demand and Popularity:** Guns utilized often in competitive play (like the AK-47, M4A1-S, and AWP) naturally command greater rates than niche weapons like the Negev or Bizon.
2. **Professional Play:** When a popular esports gamer (like s1mple, ZywOo, or NiKo) makes an amazing play utilizing a specific skin, its rate often spikes overnight.
3. **Pattern Templates:** Certain skins make use of a randomized pattern index (0 to 999).
 - *Case Hardened* skins, for example, can have a huge quantity of "blue gem" protection, driving their prices into tens of countless dollars.
 - *Fade* percentages determine just how much of the rainbow gradient shows up on the weapon.
4. **Stickers and Souvenirs:** Applying expert tournament sticker labels can sometimes add value, particularly if they are unusual autographs or from discontinued Major champions.

4. How to Acquire CS: GO Skins
