- Licenses from countries that signed the **1968 Vienna Convention on Road Traffic** can normally be exchanged straight, though tests might be needed depending on bilateral arrangements and residency period.
- Licenses from countries under the **1949 Geneva Convention** usually need passing the theoretical state exam.

- Your current driving license (with a sworn Polish translation, if appropriate).

4. How long does it require to get a Polish driving license with assistance?

5. Do I need a PESEL number to get a driving license in Poland?

Yes. A PESEL number (or a substitute tax identifier in specific temporary cases) is mandatory for developing your PKK profile and registering for tests in Poland.
