Why Are Case Battles So Popular?

3. Diversify Your Case Selection

Prevent discarding your entire spending plan into a single high-tier case like *Operation Bravo* or *Recoil*. Rather, mix low-tier, stable-return cases with a couple of high-variance cases to balance the danger.

4. Utilize "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

Crazy Mode (where the most affordable overall worth wins) flips basic logic on its head. While it can be enjoyable, it relies completely on hitting inexpensive, low-tier drops. Do not approach this mode with basic case-opening logic.

Are CS: GO case field of honor legal?
