In suburban areas like Rockville, Bethesda, and Gaithersburg, homes tend to be larger with more furniture and often include garages, basements, or storage sheds that need to be cleared. Movers in DMV suburban zones need to plan truck routes around residential streets, cul-de-sacs, and homeowner association rules that sometimes restrict where moving trucks can park overnight.
