Rates fluctuate continuously; they reflect typical Steam Community Market listings at the time of composing.

Factors That Influence Rarity

1. **Drop Rate**-- The probability of a case appearing as a random drop is extremely low for some older cases. For example, the Operation Bravo Case drops are roughly 0.15% compared to 1-- 2% for modern cases.
2. **Event Duration**-- Cases connected to limited-time operations (e.g., Bravo, Shattered Web) stop to be granted as soon as the operation ends. This produces a hard supply ceiling.
3. **Promo Type**-- Some cases were just dispersed through purchase of specific "Starter Packs" or as rewards for participation in competitions. These promotion-only cases can be more elusive than standard drop-only boxes.

- **Steam Marketplace:** The primary place for buying cases outright. Costs are set by sellers; market costs use.
- **Third-Party Trading Sites:** Platforms such as CSGOSkins.gg, Skinbay, or Buff.163 often list cases at somewhat lower commissions, however verify seller credibility.
