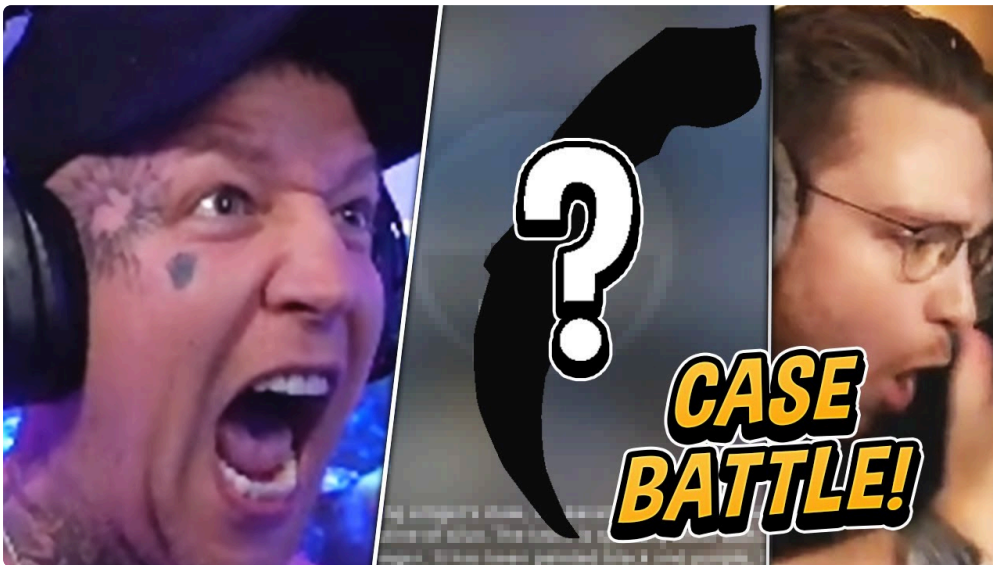


The CS2 Case: A Comprehensive Guide to Counter-Strike 2's New Loot System
