- **Appeal:** Simple guidelines and familiar mechanics attract casual and experienced gamblers alike.

4. Prize/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a cumulative pot. Each skin contributes tickets based on its dollar worth. A random draw picks a winner, where a greater total contribution yields a higher analytical chance of winning the entire pot.
- **Appeal:** The supreme "high-roller" video game mode, where single lucky winners can walk away with thousands of dollars in rare digital products.

The Economics of Skin Trading and Withdrawal
