Valve's Stance and Regulatory Crackdowns

- **The 2016 Cease-and-Desist Era:** Valve sent official notifications to lots of popular skin gambling websites, demanding they shut down operations as they violated the Steam Subscriber Agreement.
- **Trade Hold Updates:** To suppress instantaneous trading and money laundering, Valve introduced an obligatory 7-day trade hold on any traded skin. While this briefly interfered with the gambling market, operators quickly adapted utilizing P2P systems and crypto cash-outs.
- **Legal Scrutiny:** Governments worldwide have started taking notification. Class-action claims, government examinations, and statutory restrictions in numerous countries have required operators to constantly move domains and legal structures.
