- **The Formula:** $f^* = \frac{bp - q}{b}$
 - f^* = % of the bankroll to wager
 - b = decimal odds minus 1
 - p = probability of winning
 - q = possibility of losing ($1 - p$)
- **Application:** Most casual gamblers utilize a "Fractional Kelly" (e.g., wagering just 25% of what the formula recommends) to decrease volatility.
