4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot video game, numerous gamers toss skins into a main pot. Each skin adds to the gamer's total portion opportunity of winning the entire pot (based on the dollar worth of their contribution). A virtual spinner picks a winning ticket, and one fortunate player takes home all the deposited skins.
