- **Continuous Enforcement:** Valve regularly bans bots associated with recognized gambling platforms, leading to the confiscation of millions of dollars in virtual items held by those bots.

Despite these measures, the industry has actually adapted by using cryptocurrency deposits, peer-to-peer trading systems, and shifting domains to bypass blocks.
