

Outdoor lighting covers more than one job

Ask ten people around Greenville what outdoor lighting means and you will get several answers. For some it is the roof edge, for others the yard, and for plenty of people it is the dark part of the property they never fixed. They are related jobs with different answers.

The building itself

Permanent outdoor lighting puts an LED channel along the roof edge, color matched so it disappears in daylight, and run from your phone. That covers holiday color in December and everyday warm white the rest of the year.

The ground level

Below the roofline, the work is paths, garden beds, trees and steps. Patio lighting is what gets the patio used after dark. Security lighting is for the corners, which is a different question from making the front look good. Accent lighting picks out the details.

How to decide what you need

A house that vanishes after sunset needs light on the building. Trouble getting from the car to the door is a landscape lighting problem. If the complaint is "December is a whole weekend of work", permanent lighting is the answer. Most properties end up with two of the three.

The commercial side

On commercial property, the same work answers different questions. Facade and storefront lighting keeps a building visible after dark. Patio lighting decides whether the outdoor seating gets used after six. Parking and [permanent christmas lights](#) walkway lighting comes down to safety, and the entrance is the first thing anybody sees.

What the first visit covers

The consultation is somebody looking at the house and asking questions. Expect to be asked where you walk, where you sit, what stays dark. Those answers shape the design more than a style preference does. You should come out of it knowing what is proposed and why. An unexplained plan is not something to sign off on. A few details make the first call go further. One story or two. Roof pitch, if you know it. How long the driveway runs. Whether there are trees worth lighting. None of it needs to be measured. It just shortens the distance between the first call and a real plan.

One company, one plan

It works better as a single design, instead of pieces added a year apart. What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
