1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Possibly the most popular skin in the video game, the Dragon Lore includes a mythical dragon breathing fire throughout the body of the sniper rifle. Initially dropped exclusively on specific maps like Cobblestone throughout major tournaments, these memento bundles are now exceptionally rare. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by super star gamer Skadoodle notoriously sold for over £ 60,000 years back, and prices have only escalated given that.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a basic Case Hardened AK-47 is fairly budget-friendly, the top-tier pattern indices-- particularly Pattern 661-- cover practically the whole leading receiver of the weapon in a pristine, reflective blue. Due to the fact that the odds of unpacking this specific pattern with an excellent float worth are astronomically low, these items have commanded private deals exceeding six figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Howl
