- **Consumable Items:** Once a key is utilized to open a case, it disappears from the player's inventory, replaced by the unboxed cosmetic item.
- **Universal Origin:** Originally, standard keys might open nearly any standard weapon case, though this rule has actually moved over time.
- **Trade Restrictions:** To combat credit card fraud and bot farming, Valve executed rigorous trade and market hangs on secrets purchased in-game or via the Steam store.

### The Economics: How Valve Changed the Key Market

In October 2019, Valve made a seismic shift in the CS: GO economy. Prior to this update, secrets was among the most traded and liquid possessions in the game. Players utilized secrets almost like a secondary currency--trading them amongst themselves for skins, games, and third-party cash without ever opening a single case.

Criminal networks and carders exploited this liquidity by buying secrets with taken credit funds, trading them immediately, and cashing out. To fight this, **Valve made all newly acquired secrets untradeable and unmarketable**.

This single update caused an enormous shockwave in the trading community, permanently separating "investable skins" from "functional secrets."

## Types of Keys in Counter-Strike

Not all keys are developed equal. Over the years, Valve presented several variations of keys tied to specific collections or events.



### 1. Requirement Case Keys

Acquired straight from the in-game shop for £ 2.50. These can open the vast bulk of standard weapon cases presently dropping in the video game.

### 2. Operation Keys

Throughout specific operations (like Operation Hydra, Breakout, or Wildfire), Valve released operation-specific cases together with devoted operation secrets. When the operation ended, these keys typically maintained their functionality for their specific cases, becoming collector's items.

### 3. Esport Keys

Introduced early in CS: GO's life expectancy to help fund reward pools for expert competitions, Esport keys opened Esport-specific green, blue, and red cases. These are exceptionally rare today.

No. Valve has actually never put basic case keys on sale. Their cost has stayed locked at £ 2.50 GBP (changed for local currency) for the lifetime of the game.

### 5. What takes place to keys if I delete them?

If you erase a secret from your stock, it is completely ruined. Valve will not restore erased products, so exercise severe caution when handling your inventory.
