- **The Martingale System:** A timeless progressive betting strategy where a player doubles their bet after every loss, trying to recover all previous losses plus an earnings when they lastly win. This needs an enormous bankroll and frequently strikes table or website limitations throughout a losing streak.
- **The Anti-Martingale (Paroli) System:** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, trying to take advantage of winning streaks while reducing damage during cold runs.
- **High-Risk Hunting:** Waiting for extended streaks of low crashes (e.g., numerous rounds under 1.50 x) and betting high on a viewed "high multiplier" coming soon. (Note: This comes down with the Gambler's Fallacy; every round is an independent occasion).
