

Home Depot Garage Door Replacement Cost in Los Angeles

Home Depot garage door installation cost in Los Angeles varies according to the door, the installation package, site conditions, and whether the project includes removal of an existing door. A basic garage door may have a more affordable product price, while an insulated garage door, custom garage door, decorative windows, upgraded hardware, or a double garage door can raise the total.
