- **Crazy Mode (Reverse Battles):** A fun twist where the goal is inverted-- the player with the *lowest* total worth at the end wins all the items.

Always make sure that the platform you are using utilizes a **Provably Fair** cryptographic algorithm. This guarantees that the website can not manipulate the result of your case drops, making sure a transparent and genuine video gaming environment.
