If you have collected lots of low-tier blue and purple skins from opening cases, CS2 uses an alternative mechanism: **The Trade-Up Contract**.

Gamers can trade 10 weapon skins of the specific same rarity tier for one weapon skin of the instant next higher rarity tier, chosen randomly from one of the collections represented in the traded products.

Finest Practices for Trade-Ups:

- **Check Float Values:** The wear condition (float) of the resulting skin is determined mathematically based on the typical floats of the 10 input skins.
- **Control the Pool:** Try to use inputs from the very same collection to guarantee the output skin you want, instead of blending collections and leaving your result to pure opportunity.

Tips and Best Practices for CS2 Openings
