

A malfunctioning garage door can impact safety, parking, weather protection, and your daily routine. An extension spring is positioned along the horizontal tracks and stretches during operation. Both types store substantial energy.

Signs of a failed garage door spring may include a clear gap in the spring, a door that feels abnormally heavy, cables that appear slack, or a door that rises only a few inches. You may also hear a sharp popping sound when the spring breaks. Do not undertake to lift a heavy door manually or adjust the spring without suitable equipment.

Garage door spring replacement should generally be completed by a skilled technician.
