Understanding the Wheel Segments

The 52-segment wheel is divided into numbers and reward video games. The numbers pay out even cash or much better, while the perk signs provide gamers entry into the game's heading acts.

Here is how the wheel is dispersed:

- **Number 1:** 21 sections (Pays 1:1)
- **Number 2:** 13 sectors (Pays 2:1)
- **Number 5:** 7 segments (Pays 5:1)
- **Number 10:** 4 sections (Pays 10:1)
- **Coin Flip:** 4 sections
- **Pachinko:** 2 sectors
- **Money Hunt:** 2 segments
- **Crazy Time:** 1 section

The Top Slot Feature

Before every spin of the main wheel, a two-reel mini fruit machine situated directly above the wheel spins simultaneously.

- **Reel 1** display screens a bet spot (either a number or a reward video game).
- **Reel 2** display screens a multiplier (varying from 2x as much as 50x).

If the bet area and the multiplier align horizontally, that multiplier is used to the matching sector on the main wheel for that round. If the wheel arrive on that segment, all wins for that bet are increased appropriately, setting the phase for enormous payments.

Dive Into the Four Bonus Rounds

The true magic-- and volatility-- of Crazy Time depends on its 4 interactive perk rounds. These games transportation players out of the studio by means of CGI and offer the game's biggest win capacity.

1. Coin Flip

The easiest of the benefit rounds, Coin Flip features a red-and-blue token turned by a machine.

- **How it works:** Before the flip, both sides of the coin are appointed random multipliers.
- **The Outcome:** Whichever color lands deal with up awards the gamer the multiplier connected to that side.

2. Pachinko

Motivated by the traditional Japanese arcade game, Pachinko features a big physical wall filled with pegs.

- **How it works:** The host drops a puck from the top of the board. It bounces arbitrarily down through the pegs up until it lands in one of several multiplier slots at the bottom.
- **The "Double" Feature:** If the puck lands in a "DOUBLE" slot, all multipliers at the bottom of the board double, and the puck is dropped again for an opportunity at even bigger prizes.

3. Money Hunt

Cash Hunt is an interactive shooting gallery game presented on a huge screen with 108 random multipliers concealed <https://bitz.io/games/crazy-time> behind various signs (like a cactus, a target, or a chef's hat).

- **How it works:** Players utilize an on-screen cannon to intend and contend a symbol of their choice before the countdown timer ends. Once the timer ends, all gamers reveal the multiplier concealed behind their selected target. (Note: In automated play, the game chooses a target for the player).

4. Crazy Time

The supreme reward round and the hardest to trigger. The host opens a red door, leading players into a surreal, vibrantly colored virtual world featuring a huge, 64-segment wheel.

- **How it works:** Players should pick one of three flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The host spins the wheel, and whichever multiplier the chosen flapper indicate when the wheel stops is awarded to the gamer.
- **The "Double" and "Triple" sections:** Just like Pachinko, if the wheel stops on a "DOUBLE" or "TRIPLE" sector, all multipliers on the wheel boost accordingly, and the wheel is spun once again. This is where the maximum 20,000 x multiplier can be accomplished.

Benefits and drawbacks of Playing Crazy Time

Like all gambling establishment games, Crazy Time comes with its own unique set of benefits and potential downsides.

Pros:

- **Unmatched Entertainment Value:** High-energy hosts, brilliant visuals, and game-show styling make it incredibly fun to view and play.
- **Huge Win Potential:** With the help of the Top Slot and reward round multipliers, wins can reach up to 20,000 x the stake.
- **Interactive Elements:** Games like Cash Hunt and Crazy Time require (or mimic) gamer participation, including a layer of engagement not found in traditional slots.

Cons:

- **High Volatility:** Because a big part of the wheel's payment capacity is connected to bonus offer rounds, dry spells can rapidly drain pipes a bankroll.
- **Lower RTP on Bonuses:** While basic number bets have a fairly good Return to Player, wagering exclusively on reward rounds normally brings a lower theoretical RTP.
- **Fast-Paced:** Rounds happen rapidly, which can cause overspending if gamers do not manage their bankrolls carefully.

Basic Strategies for Crazy Time

While Crazy Time is a game of pure chance dictated by a random number generator (RNG) and physical wheel physics, players frequently employ wagering techniques to manage threat and extend their playtime.

- **The Cover-All Strategy:** Betting on all or the majority of the segments (numbers and bonus offer games) guarantees you seldom miss a spin, though the expense of covering the board can exceed the smaller payments.
- **Perk Chasing:** Focusing solely on the reward rounds (Coin Flip, Pachinko, Cash Hunt, and Crazy Time). This is a high-risk, high-reward technique considering that reward rounds take place on just 9 of the 52 sections.
- **Statistical Betting:** Relying on the video game's history tracker. Some players like to bank on sectors that have not hit in a long time (the "hot/cold" misconception), though previous spins statistically have no bearing on future results.

Crazy Time has actually rightfully earned its reputation as a leader in live dealer entertainment. By integrating the classic charm of a tv video game show with modern digital graphics and huge payout capacity, Evolution Gaming has actually produced an experience that interest both casual gamers and high rollers alike.
