Recharging requires EPA certification, specialized recovery equipment, and proper evacuation of any remaining charge—a process only licensed technicians should perform. When does compressor failure signal the end of your refrigerator's sealed-system life?

The compressor is the heart of the sealed system—it circulates refrigerant and creates the pressure differential that moves heat. Compressors typically last the full 10- to 15-year lifespan if refrigerant charge remains stable. But if refrigerant leaks, the compressor works harder, overheats, and fails prematurely. A failed compressor cannot be rebuilt; it must be replaced as a whole unit, sealed system and all. Replacement costs \$600 to \$1,200 plus labor. On a refrigerator already 8 years old, replacing the compressor often costs more than buying new. How does sealed-system repair cost relate to refrigerator age and remaining lifespan?

The 50-50 rule applies here: if repair costs exceed 50% of a new unit's price, replacement is usually wiser. Sealed-system work—leak detection, evacuation, recovery, and recharge—can easily run \$500 to \$1,000. A new mid-range refrigerator costs \$800 to \$2,000. If your refrigerator is 12 years old and needs sealed-system work, you're paying for 3 or 4 more years of potential use at best, but risking another leak or compressor failure within a year.

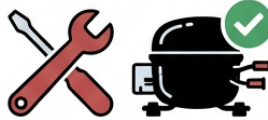
