1. Melee Weapons

- **Custom SMG:** High rate of fire, lethal in close-quarters fight.
- **Semi-Automatic Rifle (SAR):** The workhorse of mid-game *Rust*, using terrific precision at medium range.

3. Endgame Armaments (Tier 3)

Requiring a Level 3 Workbench and important elements, these weapons dominate open-field battles and base defense.

- **Assault Rifle (AK):** The gold requirement of *Rust* PvP due to its high damage and adaptability.
- **Bolt Action Rifle:** Ideal for long-range scouting and roof-camping.
- **M249:** A devastating light gatling gun obtainable only from Bradley APC or Helicopter dog crates.

Understanding Protection and Armor
