Neither preference is wrong. The secret is making selections with eyes open. If you intend a mudroom wherein teens drop backpacks and soccer cleats, a complicated prefinished internal with plywood cores and durable pulls beats museum-grade veneer. If you need a showpiece vanity, splurge on panel matching and hardware that sounds like rings.
