- **Terminal Mode:** A feature on choose sites where the individual who drops the single lowest-value product or loses a particular round gets an alleviation reward or an opportunity at a redemption spin.

- **Prioritize Reputable Sites:** Never use an unproven platform. Stick to popular sites with positive community evaluations, transparent provably fair systems, and safe and secure withdrawal processes.
