4. Prize

In a Jackpot game, numerous gamers toss skins into a main pot. Each skin adds to the player's total percentage chance of winning the whole pot (based on the dollar worth of their contribution). A virtual spinner selects a winning ticket, and one fortunate gamer takes home all the deposited skins.
