- **Cryptocurrency/Cash:** Some platforms enable you to squander your balance by means of crypto (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) or alternative payment processors.

4. What does "Provably Fair" indicate?

A "Provably Fair" system uses cryptography to show that the result of a case battle was predetermined and might not be altered by the site operator *after* you put your bet. You can confirm the fairness of each round utilizing the supplied server seeds and client seeds.

5. Can I get VAC banned for utilizing case battle sites?

Utilizing third-party trading and case-opening websites does not straight result in a Valve Anti-Cheat (VAC) ban. However, Valve sometimes updates its regards to service or bans API secrets related to automated trading bots, which can temporarily disrupt your ability to trade skins.
