If moving the celebration feels wrong , consider a dinner-only party that starts right after school and ends by 7 PM . This doesn't disrupt the school night schedule.



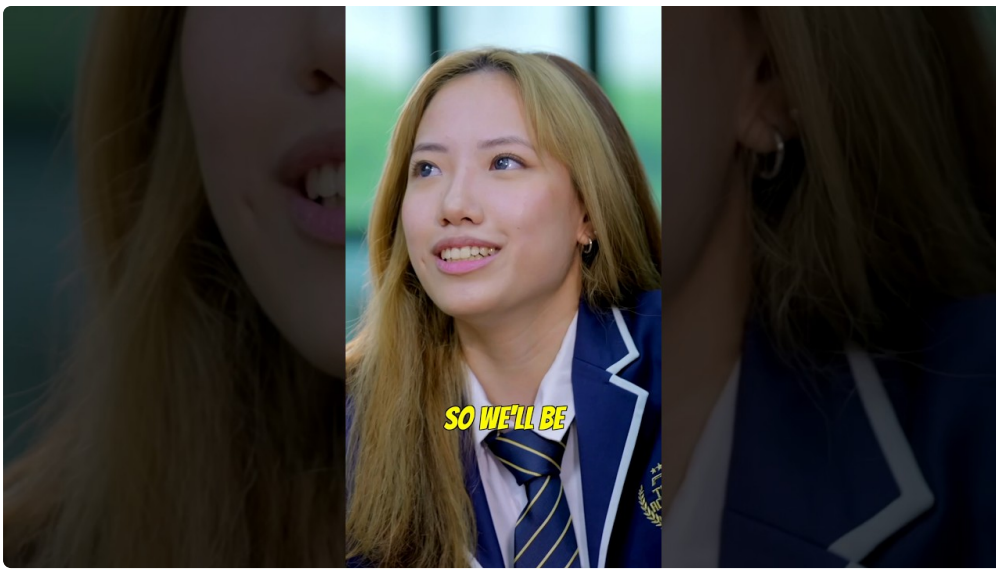
Making the Most of Time Off
